H.E President Paul Kagame joined COP28 host UAE President HH Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nayhan, UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres and other world leaders for the opening ceremony of the UN Climate Change Conference COP28.

During the two weeks at the COP28, Rwanda's delegation called for more ambitious climate action and a doubling of funding for adaptation and shared why Rwanda is an ideal destination for green investment.

05th December - President Paul Kagame was awarded the "Presidential Transport Investment Statesman of the Year". Amb. John Mirenge received the award on behalf of the Present during the Africa Investment Earthshot Leaders' Summit and NDC Investment Awards Ceremony at COP28 in Dubai. During the ceremony, the Green City Kigali project received the "Best Financeable City Initiative of the Year".

The purpose of the NDC Investment Awards is to recognize achievements across the main NDC sectors and reward the governments, institutions, and individuals driving transactions improving the investment readiness of Africa's NDC projects, requiring \$3trn of investment by 2030.

31st January 2024 in Manama, Bahrain - Hon. Musoni Paula, Rwanda's Minister of ICT & Innovation led the Rwandan delegation at the 3rd General Assembly of the Digital Cooperation Organisation (DCO).

In the margins of the Assembly, Minister Paula met with H.E Mohamed bin Thamir AlKaabi, Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications of Bahrain and Noor bint Ali Alkhulaif, Minister of Sustainable Development of Bahrain. The meetings focused on exciting avenues for bilateral collaboration between both countries.

Rwanda assumes IRENA Assembly Presidency



15th January 2024 - Amb. John Mirenge attended the 14th session of the Assembly of the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) as Rwanda assumed the Assembly Presidency. Hon. Dr Jimmy Gasore, Rwanda's Minister of Infrastructure presided over the first part of the Assembly virtually.

As the supreme decision-making organ of IRENA, the Assembly, comprising 169 Members, is a strategic global platform for inclusive and diverse discussions on all facets of the energy transition. The second part of IRENA 14th Assembly will convene in-person from 16-18 April in Abu Dhabi.

Five Rwandan women entrepreneurs in horticulture attend the Middle East Organic & Natural Expo in Dubai



Rwandan exporters participated in the Organic and Natural Exhibition in Dubai from 12-14 December 2023. The Rwanda booth offered fresh and processed avocados, French beans, passion fruits, chilis, and more. MENA has emerged as a promising market for fast-moving consumer goods and hotel, restaurant, and cafe products such as coffee, honey, fruits, and vegetables.

RDB has identified potential buyers among supermarkets, distributors, and wholesalers. Sales to such buyers would grow exports of high-value, organic and natural products to increase Rwandan export revenues. RDB expects to sign significant export deals, in terms of both revenue and volume, from the trade fair.

John Mirenge met with Rwandan coffee exporters who participated in the World of Coffee Dubai, an exhibition that connects coffee producers, manufacturers, retailers, traders, and the broader coffee industry. Discussions included promoting Rwandan Coffee in the UAE and the broader Gulf Region.

The World of Coffee Dubai is an exhibition tailored to those who wish to break into the UAE and wider Middle East's emerging coffee industry. During this year's edition, Rwandan exporters showcased their coffee products and connected with potential buyers. A coffee cupping session was organized in collaboration with the Dubai Multi-Commodity Centre (DMCC) to showcase the quality of Rwanda coffee.

COP28 President lauds Parties' success in delivering comprehensive response to Global Stocktake during closing plenary

In his statement at the closing plenary of the 28th UN Climate Change Conference (COP28), Dr. Al Jaber said, "Together, we have confronted realities, and we have set the world in the right direction. It is a balanced plan, that tackles emissions, bridges the gap on adaptation, reimagines global finance, and delivers on loss and damage. It is built on common ground.
